All of the ASMA churches are committed to serving young people and offering them opportunities to hear about, and grow in, the love of Jesus. Each church is already actively doing this, but with the help of a Youth Minister working across the area, we hope and pray that more young people will be reached. We recognise that some activities will involve bringing young people from different parishes together, whilst other initiatives will be more specific. There's already close collaboration between the ASMA clergy and amongst the three Children and Families Ministers. The Youth Minister will be joining a supportive team of lay and ordained ministers, who are all committed to sharing the Gospel through word and action.



We are looking for an enthusiastic Christian who can inspire young people to live for Jesus. The successful candidate will be collaborative, a confident communicator, a self-starter and have experience of working with 11-18's. The role will involve working with young people in church, school or community settings.

Mission Area Youth Minister serving the Avonside Mission Area Role Description and Personal Profile

Employed by: St Mary Magdalene Church, Stoke Bishop, Bristol **Location:** The Avonside Mission Area (ASMA), North West Bristol

Main Purpose: To deliver high quality Youth Ministry in a range of settings across ASMA. This will include leading regular groups for young people seeking to grow in their Christian faith, and groups to connect with those who are not yet exploring it. They will also seek to serve young people attending a secondary school in the Mission Area - Oasis Academy Brightstowe.

Reporting to: The PCC of St Mary Magdalene. This role will be line managed by the Associate Vicar of St Mary's, with input from the Vicar of St Andrew's and St Peter's. *Every effort will be made to ensure that there is clarity around line management so that the individual churches are not placing competing demands on the Youth Minister's time.*

Working closely with: The other clergy and Children and Families Ministers across ASMA.

Salary and hours: FTE £30,000 p.a (based on 37.5hrs). Part time hours of 25 per week, which will involve flexible working, including evenings and weekends. At least one full day off per week with two full days off consecutively at least once a month. Holiday entitlement 25 days per year plus Bank Holidays (pro rata). Sundays are a working day, but regular morning activities will be avoided, enabling the Youth Minister to worship at a church of their choosing in the morning.

Conditions of employment: The appointment will be subject to a probationary period of six months. Termination of employment will be subject to a notice period of three months by either party (upon successful completion of the probationary period). St Mary's Church is committed to safeguarding the welfare of children, young people and vulnerable adults and expects all employees to share this commitment. All appointments are subject to a satisfactory DBS check being received.

Main responsibilities

These reflect the current needs of the churches, but the Youth Minister would be expected to adapt their approach over time, as new opportunities arise.

- Running the existing Friday youth group for 10-14's aimed at young people from/ connected to Stoke Bishop and Sea Mills.
- Establishing an accessible weekly youth group for 14-18's aimed at young people from/ connected to Stoke Bishop and Sea Mills.
- Running the existing fortnightly youth discipleship group on Sunday evenings, open to all, but currently attended by young people from/connected to Stoke Bishop.
- Establishing connections with young people in Lawrence Weston and Avonmouth under the direction of the Vicar of those parishes. This would be for approx 6hrs per week.

Main responsibilities (cont.)

- Serving young people at Oasis Academy Brightstowe in Shirehampton in whatever way the school sees fit. This would be for approx 4 hrs per week.
- Attending 'Deeper' the monthly ASMA prayer and praise services as often as possible, encouraging young people to take part and serve.
- To communicate appropriately with parents/carers of young people, ensuring that they are well-informed about activities.
- Supporting the existing volunteers serving young people across ASMA, and safely recruiting and training new ones as needs arise.
- Ensuring that excellent Safeguarding practice is followed at all times when interacting with young people in any setting.

Additional responsibilities

These would be as time and opportunity allow.

- Pastoral care for young people across the Mission Area as needed.
- Input into Confirmation preparation for young people who are interested.
- Involvement with Year 6 Transition 'It's Your Move' sessions for any primary schools across the Mission Area willing to engage with this.
- Encouraging young people to engage in social action as a group.
- Connecting with young people through sports or arts.
- Organising an annual residential for young people connected to the ASMA churches.
- Growing young leaders.
- From time to time leading Collective Worship at primary schools across ASMA.
- Supporting existing ASMA activities aimed at children or families, such as the Easter and Christmas Schools Trail, particularly those involving Year 6 children.
- Auditing courses at Trinity College (or similar) to enable further theological study.
- Connecting with other youth and children's ministers across the city.

This job description is not exhaustive and the Youth Minister will be expected to undertake any other activity reasonably requested by their Line Manager. The job description will be reviewed, in consultation with the post holder, from time to time and amended in light of the changing needs of the role.

The right candidate will be a committed Christian with a mature faith in Jesus, and a worshipping member of a local church. There is a genuine occupational requirement that the post holder is a practising Christian.
