

Alpha Course



Starting on 21 January there will be a 10 week Alpha Course, run jointly with, and held at, St Edyth's Sea Mills. All welcome on Tuesday evenings to explore the Christian faith and to ask questions in a safe, supportive environment.

On Sunday 16 March at 4pm Bishop Neil Warwick will be coming to St Mary's for a Confirmation Service. If you would like to be confirmed and/ or baptised, making a public declaration of your intention to follow Jesus, we would love to celebrate with you at this service.

TAKE Jema as soon as possible so that we can support you as you prepare for this.

Also at the Confirmation Service there will be an opportunity for children to be Admitted to Receive Communion before Confirmation. This is open to any child, ideally 4 yrs + who has never been formally welcomed to the Lord's Table. There would be some informal preparation and children who have taken part will receive a certificate at the Confirmation service.

Church Weekend@Home! 15 March 2025



Join in with various activities on Saturday 15 March based around the theme of Going Deeper with God. The morning session will be at St Edyth's Sea Mills and will include a talk from a guest speaker, activities for our younger members and a shared act of worship together, finishing with a buffet lunch.

Monthly Tasters, an exploration of Spiritual Practices to help you develop a Rhythm of Life, offered by Bristol Diocese

The phrase Rhythm of Life is used by Christians to describe a systematic way of helping you, as an individual, deepen your relationship with God with every year that passes. It is about enabling your experience of God, rather than being busy doing things for Him.



Starting in January a team from the diocese will be offering Monthly Tasters, providing resources that give participants a taste of a type of spiritual practice. The invitation is to try it and see if you like it. Then you can decide how to develop a Rhythm of Life for yourself, based on the tasters you have enjoyed. Support and accountability will be offered through optional one hour sessions using Zoom where you can discuss your thoughts and feelings with others in small groups and ask questions of experienced practitioners.

As the year continues, here's a taster of some other things that will be on offer.

24/7 Week of Prayer 1-8 June 2025

Our Week of Prayer will coincide with the global *Thy Kingdom Come* wave of prayer which takes place in the week leading up to Pentecost.





Month of Guided Prayer during June

An opportunity to go deeper in prayer with the support of a Prayer Guide who will meet with participants weekly (for around 45 mins) for four weeks. The guides support participants and hold them accountable to the prayerful practices that they try out over the course of the month. It's a flexible, supportive approach for those who would value some guidance in trying out new ways of praying.

Gold Project

If you are feeling nudged to go deeper with God into His Word, you might like to take part in a Gold Project group which will be on offer during the summer term. The Gold Project offers group based open-learning for Christians, you can read more here <u>www.goldproject.org</u> The director of the charity is theologian Dr David Ball, who is based within the Avonside Mission Area.

Season 3: September to December

Scripture, Theology and Culture course

An opportunity to encounter Jesus, examine the Bible and explore theology with the Mullers Charity, based in Bristol. Each September a new course cohort begins, with a daytime version (Tuesdays) in person over

one year, or a digital version (accessing videos in your own time, approx. 2hrs per week) over two years. The courses are completely free and run by friendly theologians! Find out more at <u>www.mullers.org./training</u>

Am I called?

Every Autumn the diocese run a short course where people can explore whether God is calling them into a particular role within the church. It might be that over the year God is calling people from St Mary's to serve in new ways and this course could be a good place to begin.

5-4-3-2-1 Prayer Triplet

These are essentially mini versions of small groups, with the same aims of friendship, accountability, growing in faith and prayer.




